Speaking Points

- Mr. Abdelrazik is a citizen of both Sudan and Canada. In March of 2003, Mr.
 Abdelrazik returned of his own volition to Sudan, his country of origin. In August of that year Mr. Abdelrazik was incarcerated by Sudanese officials, and later released.
- Consular officials have provided Mr. Abdelrazik consular services available to Canadian citizens in distress abroad.
- As a Canadian citizen, Mr. Abdelrazik is entitled to a one-time Canadian travel document that would allow him to travel to Canada. Canada is not, however, prepared to make extraordinary arrangements to provide for Mr. Abdelrazik's travel to Canada.
- In the absence of a confirmed itinerary, the Government of Canada cannot issue a temporary travel document.
- The Federal Court of Canada has accepted evidence, which the Government of Canada introduced that Mr. Abdelrazik presents a valid security concern, because of his association with person linked to terrorism.

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Continued cooperation between Canada and the U.S. in the matters of security is
essential. We will need to continue to work closely on issues relating to the
security of North America, including the case of Mr. Abdelrazik.





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In 2003 03, ABDELRAZIK voluntarily departed Canada for Sudan. Since that time, he has twice been detained without charge by Sudanese security authorities. Most recently, he was released on 2006 07 20,

On 2006 07 20, the U.S. Department of the Treasury's Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) added ABDELRAZIK to the Global Terrorists section of the Specially Designated Nationals and Blocked Persons list. On 2006 07 21, the U.S. Department of State designated ABDELRAZIK under Executive Order 13224 for posing a significant risk of committing acts of terrorism that threaten the security of U.S. nationals and the national security. ABDELRAZIK's designation as a global terrorist enables the U.S. government to seize any of his assets and prohibit any financial transactions with a U.S. national. (NON CLASSIFIED)
