CSIS, an exceptional place to work

CSIS makes the list of Canada's Top 100 Employers and the National Capital Region's Top 25 Employers for 2009

The Canadian Security Intelligence Service (CSIS) is proud to have recently been recognized as one of Canada's top 100 employers and one of the National Capital Region's top 25 employers in the annual competition sponsored by Mediacorp Canada Inc., a specialty publisher of employment-related periodicals. The competition, now in its 10th year, identifies the companies and organizations that lead their industries in offering exceptional working conditions and progressive human resources policies. This year, the editors reviewed the recruitment histories of more than 75,000 employers from across Canada.



The selection process is overseen by a blue-ribbon academic Advisory Board., which evaluates the organizations using the following eight criteria: physical workplace; work atmosphere and social; health, financial and family benefits; vacation and time off; employee communications; performance management; training and skills development and community involvement.

The Service was selected as one of top 100 employers for several reasons, the main ones being that CSIS:

- hires older workers and counts previous work experience toward their paid vacation allowance;
- provides parental leave top-up benefits for new fathers and adoptive parents (to 93% for 37 weeks);
- offers excellent maternity leave top-up benefits for new mothers (to 93% for 52 weeks);
- initiated a recruiting campaign to hire more new employees from various ethnic communities with success — over 50% of the new intelligence officers hires in 2007 were multilingual.

Last year, the Service was selected by Mediacorp Canada Inc. as one of the top 20 employers in the National Capital Region.

Letter from the CSIS Director to SIRC

Dear Mr. Filmon:

As I am certain you are aware, media have been reporting extensively on the efforts of Canadian citizen Abousofian Abdelrazik to return to Canada following his release from detention in Sudan. In fact, recent media reporting has gone so far as to allege that Abousofian Abdelrazik was arrested by Sudanese authorities at the request of CSIS, citing documents obtained under an access to information request.

Confidential / Not to be released

The Service has stated for the public record that it does not, and has not, arranged for the arrest of Canadian citizens overseas and that, in this matter, CSIS employees have conducted themselves in accordance with the CSIS Act, Canadian law, and policy. In the interest of clarifying this matter for Canadians, I request that the Security Intelligence Review Committee - at the earliest opportunity - investigate and report on the performance of the Service's duties and functions with respect to the case of Abousofian Abdelrazik.
