ACTION OF THE JUSTICES

This table indicates, first, the number of cases on which a justice sat; second, the number of cases in which a justice wrote a judgment (whether "Majority" or "Dissent"); and third, the number of cases in which a justice did not write a judgment and concurred with the judgment of another justice. For example, Beetz J. sat on fifty-eight cases, and wrote six majority judgments and one dissenting judgment. He concurred with the majority judgment of another justice in forty-six cases and with the dissenting judgment of another justice in two cases. Further, he participated in three unattributed judgments of "The Court," and concurred with the majority judgment of Chouinard J. nine times, Dickson C.J. ten times, and so on.
