**An Act respecting the
City of Toronto**

Assented to June 23, 1994

Preamble	<p>The Corporation of the City of Toronto has applied for special legislation in respect of the matters set out in this Act.</p> <p>It is appropriate to grant the application.</p> <p>Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario, enacts as follows:</p>	<p>site signs on the designated street or part of a street.</p> <p>3. Despite subsection 128 (11) of the <i>Highway Traffic Act</i>, no by-law passed under this Act becomes effective until the requisite signs are placed on the designated street or part of a street.</p> <p>4. A by-law passed under section 1 may provide for a penalty for the contravention of that by-law, which penalty shall not exceed the penalty as provided in subsection 128 (14) of the <i>Highway Traffic Act</i>.</p> <p>5. A by-law passed under this Act may be enforced by a police officer, who may exercise the powers set out in subsection 216 (1) of the <i>Highway Traffic Act</i>.</p> <p>6. (1) This Act comes into force on the day it receives Royal Assent.</p> <p>(2) This Act is repealed on the second anniversary of the day it receives Royal Assent.</p> <p>7. By-laws re 30 km/hr rate of speed	<p>(2) Despite section 195 of the <i>Highway Traffic Act</i> and in addition to its powers under subsections 128 (2) and (3) of that Act, the council of The Corporation of the City of Toronto may by by-law designate any street or part of a street designated by by-law under subsection (1) as having a 30 kilometre per hour speed limit.</p>
