CHAPTER 260

The One Day's Rest in Seven Act

1. This Act shall be in force in every city and in every town ^{Application} having a population of 10,000 or over. R.S.O. 1937, c. 193, s. 1. ^{of Act.}

2. Except as hereinafter mentioned, every employer of ^{24 hours} labour, whether a person, partnership or corporation engaged ^{rest in every} in carrying on any hotel business, restaurant or cafe shall ^{week.} allow every person, employed in any such hotel business, restaurant or cafe at least 24 consecutive hours of rest in every 7 days, and wherever possible such 24 consecutive hours shall be on a Sunday. R.S.O. 1937, c. 193, s. 2.

3. Section 2 shall not apply to,

Exceptions.

(a) watchmen, janitors, superintendents or foremen;

(b) employees who are not employed for more than 5 hours in any one day,

but nothing in this Act shall authorize any work on Sundays now prohibited by law. R.S.O. 1937, c. 193, s. 3; 1942, c. 34, s. 25.

4. Every employer who contravenes this Act shall be guilty **Penalty.** of an offence and on summary conviction shall be liable to a penalty of not more than \$100. R.S.O. 1937, c. 193, s. 4.
