CHAPTER 104

An Act respecting the Borough of Scarborough

Assented to April 29th, 1977

WHEREAS The Corporation of the Borough of Scar-Preamble borough, herein called the Corporation, hereby applies for special legislation in respect of the matter hereinafter set forth; and whereas it is expedient to grant the application;

Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario, enacts as follows:

1.—(1) The council of the Corporation may pass by-laws, Council may pass by-laws

requiring

- (a) to require the occupants of commercial establish-removal ments, retail stores and restaurants to daily remove all litter from the sidewalks abutting the commercial establishment, store or restaurant, including sidewalks in shopping centres:
- (b) to require the owner of a shopping centre to daily remove all litter from the common areas including the parking lot but not including the sidewalks abutting stores or restaurants;
- (c) to require the occupants of commercial establishments, including retail stores and restaurants, with a common parking lot appurtenant thereto, that are situate on lands other than on a shopping centre, to daily remove all litter from the parking lot.
- (2) A by-law passed under the authority of this section Enforcement shall be enforceable in the same manner as a by-law passed under the authority of The Municipal Act and any such R.S.O. 1970. by-law may impose penalties of not more than \$1,000, exclusive of costs, upon every person who contravenes any provision of the by-law.

Commence-ment

2. This Act comes into force on the day it receives Royal Assent.

Short title

3. This Act may be cited as The Borough of Scarborough Act, 1977.
