## CHAPTER 179

## An Act respecting the City of Hamilton

Assented to May 16th, 1972 Session Prorogued December 15th, 1972

HEREAS The Corporation of the City of Hamilton Preamble hereby applies for special legislation in respect of the matters hereinafter set forth; and whereas it is expedient to grant the application;

Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario, enacts as follows:

- 1. Section 2 of The City of Hamilton Act, 1966, being s.2. chapter 171, as amended by the Statutes of Ontario, 1967, chapter 115, section 1 and the Statutes of Ontario, 1968, chapter 152, section 1, is further amended by adding thereto the following subsection:
  - (1b) Where the spouse of a deceased person to whom a Continuation credit was allowed under subsection 1 credit was allowed under subsection 1, spouse
    - (a) has attained the age of sixty-five years at the time of the decease; and
    - (b) would otherwise have been eligible for a credit under subsection 1 if that surviving spouse had attained the age of seventy years and was in receipt of a governmental benefit under R.S.C. 1970. the Old Age Security Act (Canada); and

(c) is upon the decease, the owner and occupant of the residence which was the personal residence of the surviving spouse and the deceased,

the council of The Corporation of the City of Hamilton may by by-law authorize and direct that the credit shall be allowed to the surviving spouse.

- 2. This Act comes into force on the day it receives Royal Commencement. Assent.
- 3. This Act may be cited as The City of Humilton Act, 1972 Short title (No. 2),
