## CHAPTER 276.

## The One Day's Rest in Seven Act.

**1.** This Act shall be in force in every city and in every town having a population of 10,000 or over. 1922, c. 93, s. 1.

Application  
of Act.

**2.** Except as hereinafter mentioned, every employer of labour, whether a person, partnership or corporation engaged in carrying on any hotel business, restaurant or cafe shall allow every person, employed in any such hotel business, restaurant or cafe at least twenty-four consecutive hours of rest in every seven days, and wherever possible said twenty-four consecutive hours shall be on a Sunday. 1922, c. 93, s. 2.

**3.** Section 2 shall not apply to:—

Exceptions.

- (a) Watchmen, janitors, superintendents, or foremen;
- (b) Any class of employees in any other capacity in any such hotel business, restaurant or cafe where there are not more than two employees of such class;
- (c) Employees who are not employed for more than five hours in any one day;

but nothing in this Act shall authorize any work on Sundays now prohibited by law. 1922, c. 93, s. 3.

Proviso.

**4.**—(1) Every employer who is guilty of a contravention of this Act shall incur a penalty not exceeding \$100.

Penalty.

(2) *The Summary Convictions Act* shall apply to prosecutions under this Act. 1922, c. 93, s. 4.
