An Act Respecting Champerty.

HIS MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of Ontario, enacts as follows:—

- 1. Champertors be they that move pleas and suits, or cause Definition to be moved, either by their own procurement, or by others, pertors, and sue them at their proper costs, for to have part of the land in variance, or part of the gains. 33 Edw. I.
- 2. All champertous agreements are forbidden, and invalid. Champertous agreements (Added in the Revision of 1897.)
